
RW-C Book Group

God Comes Near at Christmas

During the Christmas season, there are many people who think that God is distant from them. Maybe they're confronted with the fact that they actually don't believe anything in the Christmas story. It doesn't make any sense to them.

> God says, "You don't have come to me. You don't have to find me. I come to you."

Or, maybe it is a person who says, "I wish I had a relationship with God, but I don't." Or, maybe God just seems like a distant, harsh judge or the great chess player who moves the chess pieces around the board in an impersonal way. What is beautiful about the Christmas story is that God says:

> You don't have come to me. You don't have to find me. I come to you. I bridge the gap between you and me. In ways that you could never move toward me, I will move toward you. I will live with you, and I will live for you. I will do what you couldn't ever do. And I will pay the penalty that you should've paid so that you could be near me.

RWC GRIEF SUPPORT GROUP

Did you know RWC has a Grief Support Group? We have been here 3 years and welcomed many residents through our doors— into the Chesapeake Game Room—the second Wednesday of each month at 11am.

Grief comes to us in different ways and grieving can be a difficult and painful process. We grieve many types of losses: death of family, friends, pets, other RWC residents; separation of spouses living together progressing from Independent Living to Assisted Living and Healthcare; to name a few.

We are a safe environment where one can tell his story and express feelings confidentially, knowing that others will be understanding, non-judgmental, and supportive.

We are a place for establishing a connection with others to decrease the isolation that grief brings. A

place for learning there are many different ways to grieve, all of which are natural and acceptable. We occasionally supplement our conversations with knowledgeable speakers who help deepen our understanding of ourselves and one another. We also provide helpful other resources such as a discussion book "Healing After Loss" by Martha Hickman.

- Can increase motivation for a client to participate in an exercise program.
