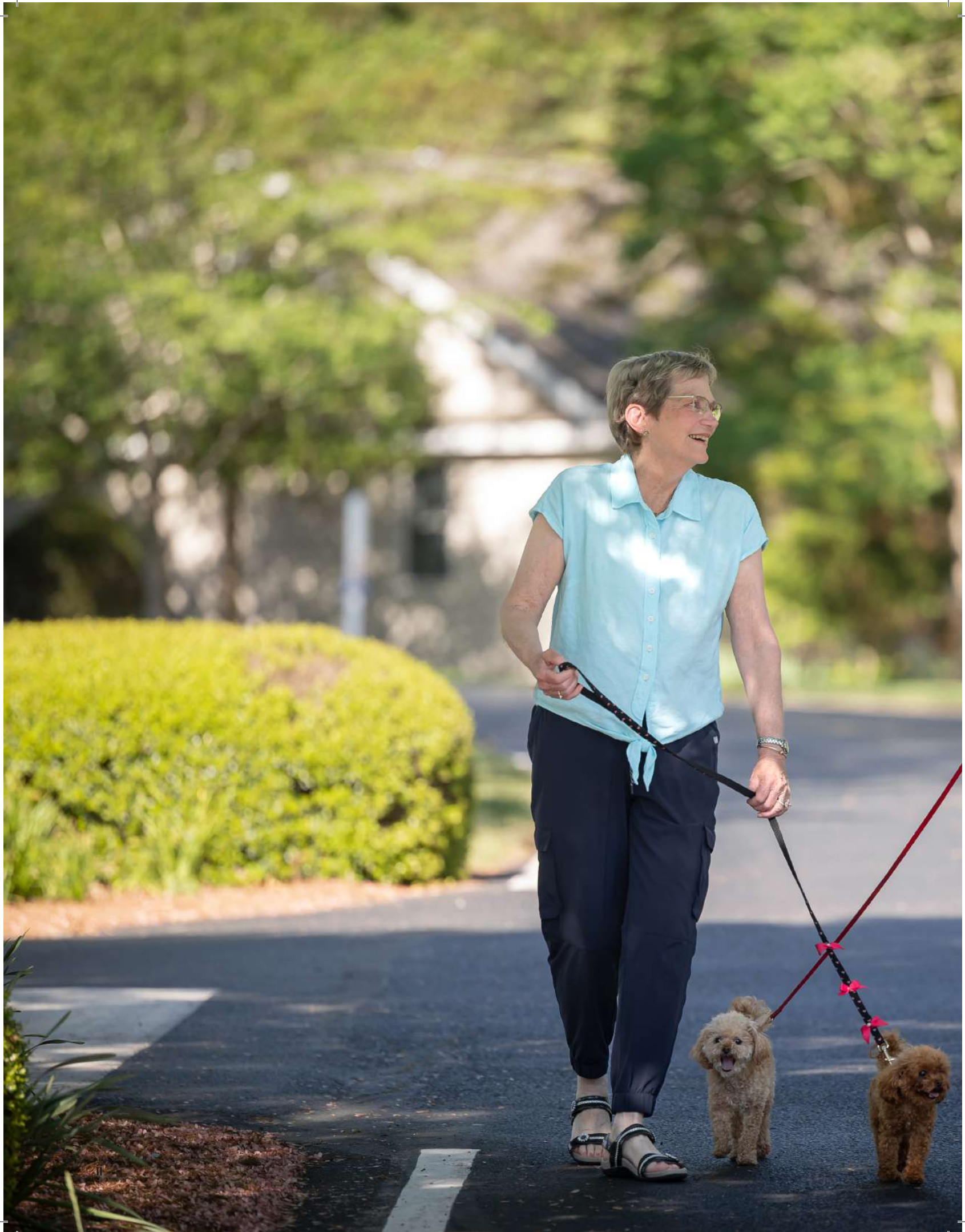

Investing in Our Community

At Rappahannock Westminister-Canterbury (RWC), our mission extends far beyond the care we provide within our community. Every day, we invest in the people, businesses, and organizations that help make the Northern Neck and Middle Peninsula strong, vibrant places to live and work.

At the heart of RWC are our dedicated employees. Their compassion, expertise, and commitment make a meaningful difference in the lives of our residents and clients every day. We are proud to employ an exceptional team whose work reflects our mission of providing outstanding care and service.

We are also grateful for the strong partnerships we have built with local businesses and organizations. These relationships provide the essential goods, services, and expertise that support our operations while strengthening the regional economy.

During fiscal year 2025–2026, RWC made a significant economic impact throughout the region. Payroll for employees living in

the greater Northern Neck totaled more than **\$9,487,000**, while employees residing in the Middle Peninsula earned more than **\$1,980,000**. In addition, RWC invested over **\$3.6 million** in goods, services, and capital assets from businesses in the Northern Neck and more than **\$250,000** with businesses in the Middle Peninsula.

As a responsible community partner, RWC also contributed **\$243,598** in personal property, real estate, and sales taxes during the fiscal year, helping support the public services and infrastructure that benefit our entire region.

These investments represent more than financial figures—they reflect our commitment to strengthening the communities we proudly call home. We are deeply grateful to our employees, business partners, and community organizations whose collaboration and support enable RWC to fulfill its mission while contributing to the economic vitality and quality of life throughout the Northern Neck and Middle Peninsula.

At Rappahannock Westminster-Canterbury, well-being is at the heart of everything we do. It is reflected in our commitment to nurturing the physical, emotional, social, spiritual, and financial well-being of every resident. Well-being also includes the confidence of knowing that financial hardship will never mean losing the place you call home. Through the Fellowship Fund, the Rappahannock Westminster-Canterbury Foundation provides financial assistance to residents who have outlived their financial resources, allowing them to remain in the community they love with dignity and peace of mind.

The Foundation also empowers residents and friends of RWC to invest in the programs and spaces that enrich daily life. Gifts support initiatives such as the Butterfly Sanctuary, Parkinson's Support programs, educational opportunities, and countless other projects that enhance the resident experience. Provides materials and supplies to attract Monarch Butterflies and support their process of metamorphosis on the RWC campus.



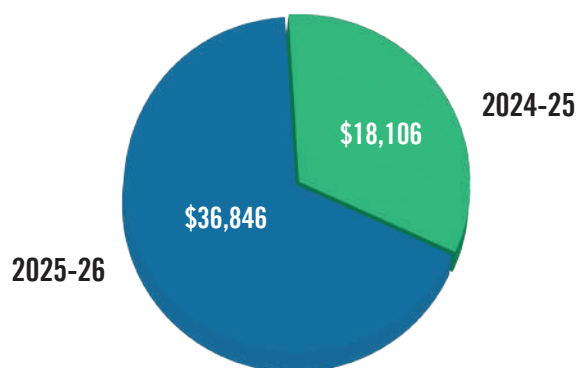
